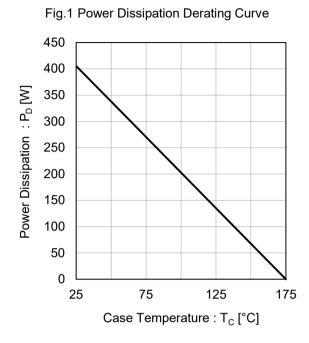

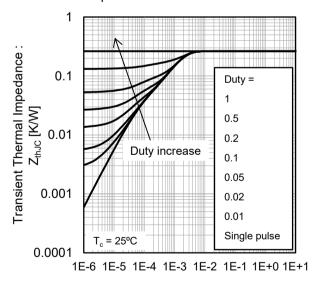

Fig.3 Typical Transient Thermal Impedance vs. Pulse Width



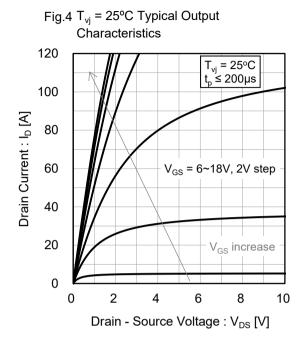
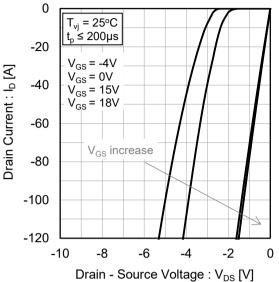


Fig.5  $T_{vj}$  = 25°C 3rd Quadrant Characteristics



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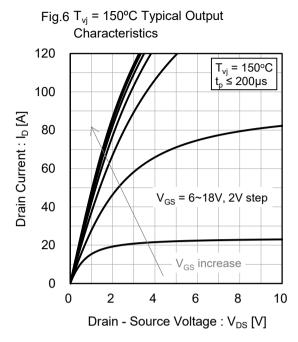


Fig.7 T<sub>vj</sub> = 150°C 3rd Quadrant Characteristics T<sub>vj</sub> = 150°C t<sub>p</sub> ≤ 200µs -20  $V_{GS} = -4V$   $V_{GS} = 0V$   $V_{GS} = 15V$   $V_{GS} = 18V$ Drain Current : I<sub>D</sub> [A] -40 -60 V<sub>GS</sub> increase -80 -100 -120 -8 -6 0 Drain - Source Voltage : V<sub>DS</sub> [V]

Fig.9 Typical Transfer Characteristics (I)

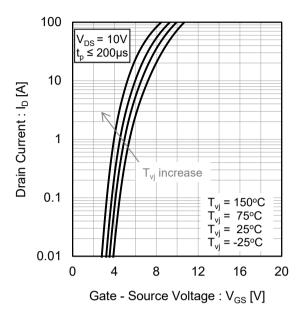


Fig.10 Typical Transfer Characteristics (II)

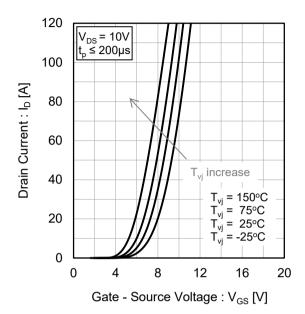


Fig.11 Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Virtual Junction Temperature

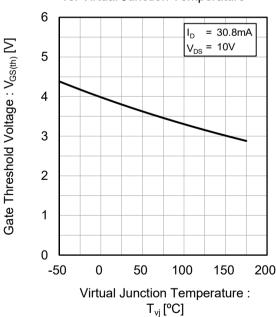
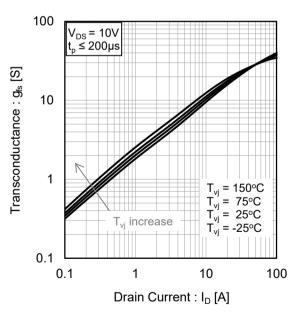
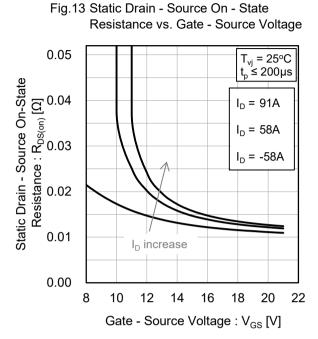


Fig.12 Transconductance vs. Drain Current

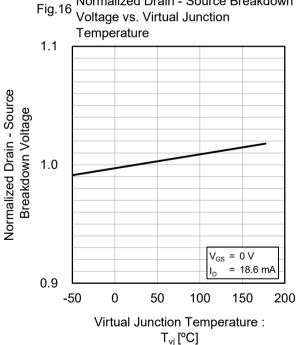




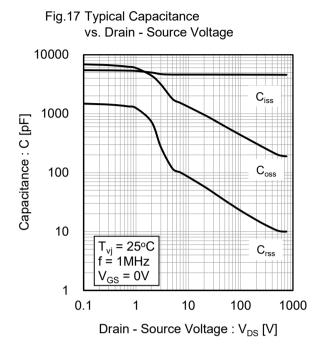

Normalized Drain - Source Breakdown



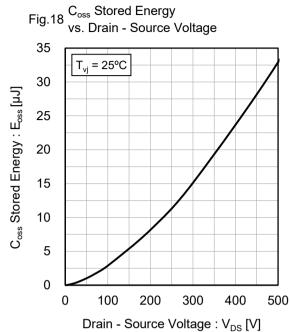
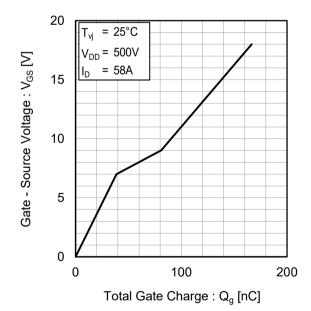
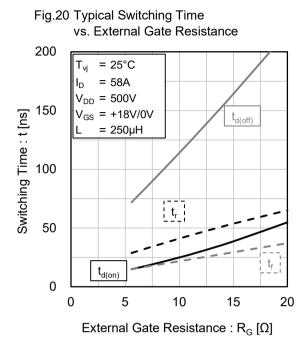


Fig.19 Dynamic Input Characteristics

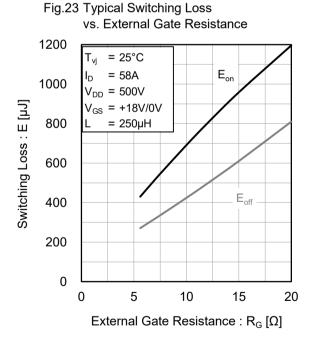

Fig.1-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit

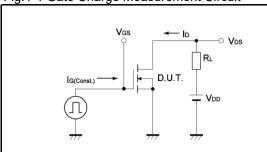


Fig.2-1 Switching Characteristics Measurement Circuit

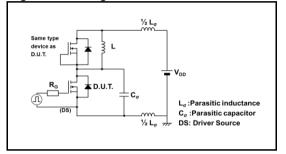


Fig.2-3 Waveforms for Switching Energy Loss

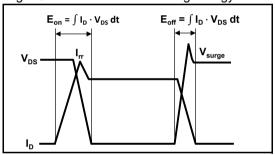


Fig.3-1 Reverse Recovery Time Measurement Circuit

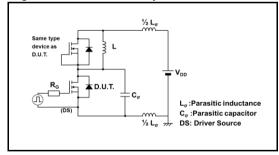


Fig.1-2 Gate Charge Waveform

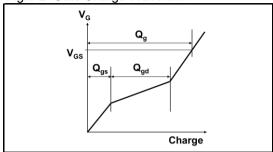


Fig.2-2 Waveforms for Switching Time

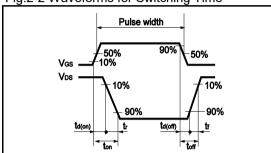
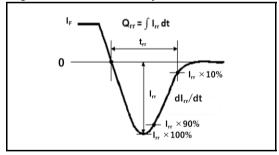
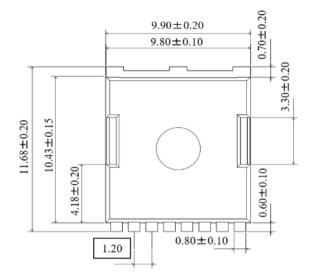
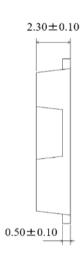


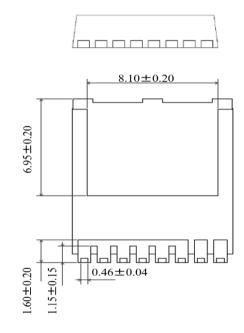
Fig.3-2 Reverse Recovery Waveform

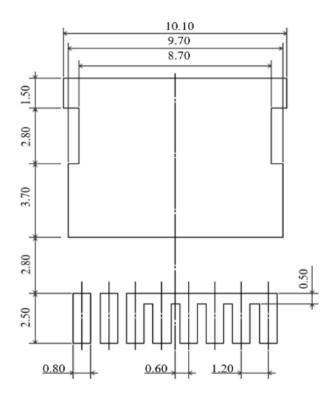

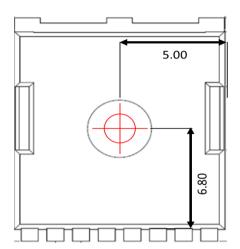
