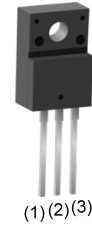

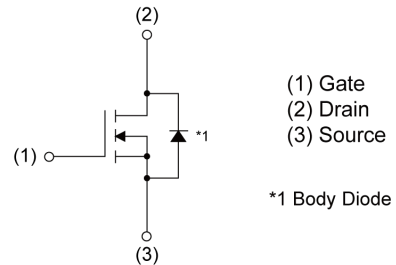

Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve

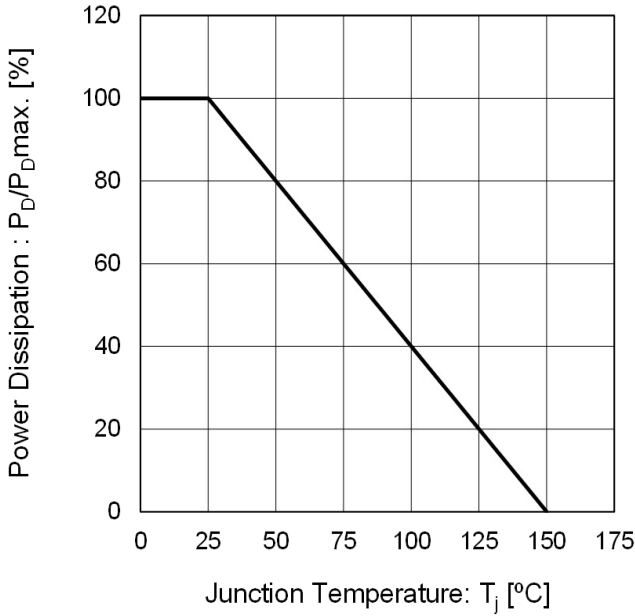


Fig.2 Drain Current Derating Curve vs. Junction Temperature

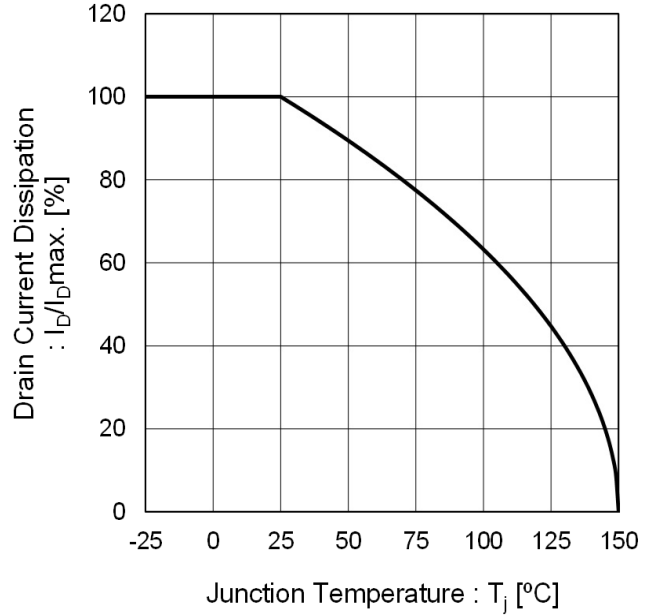


Fig.3 Normalized Transient Thermal Resistance vs. Pulse Width

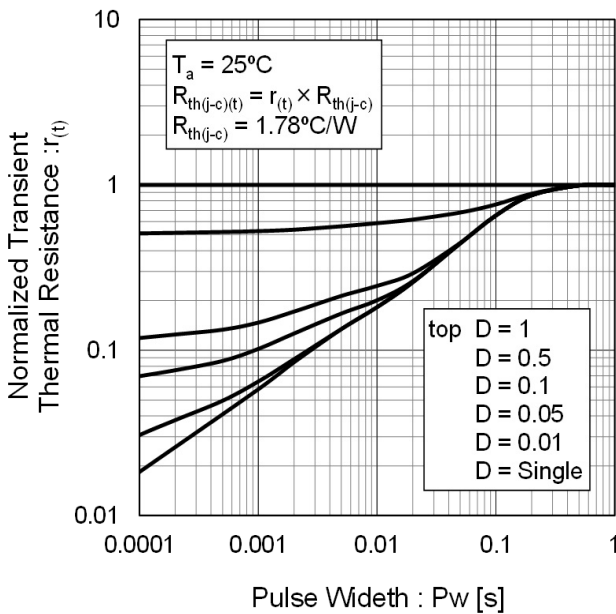
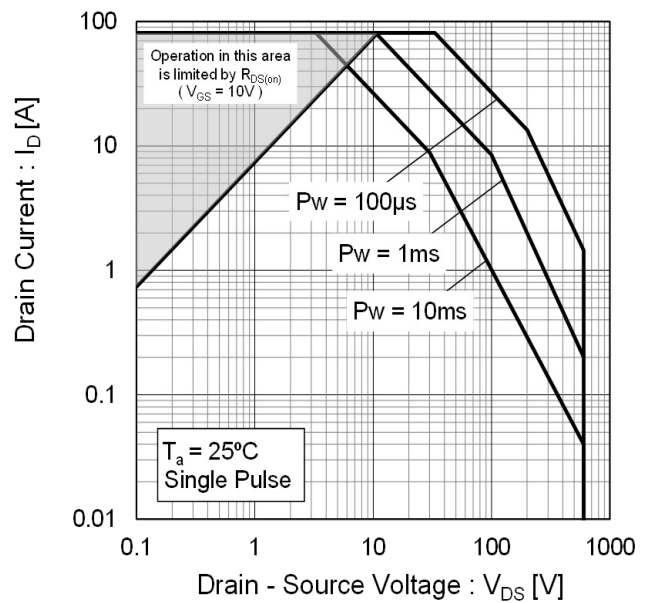


Fig.4 Maximum Safe Operating Area

Fig.5 Avalanche Energy Derating Curve vs. Junction Temperature

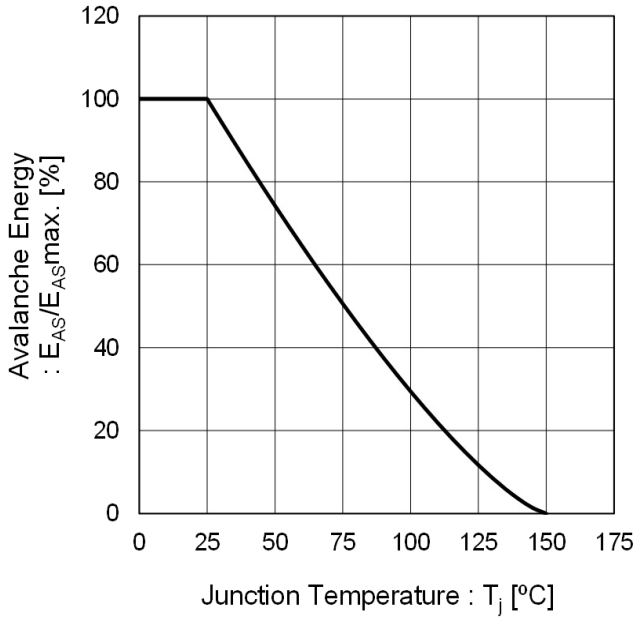


Fig.6 Normalized Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

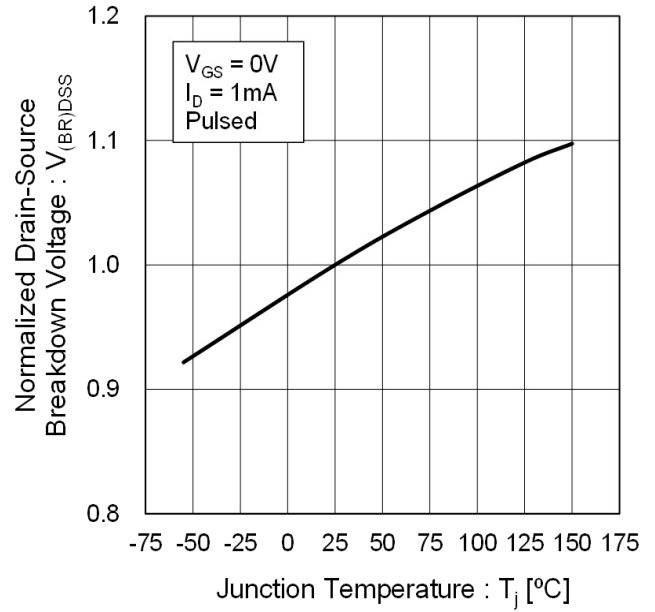


Fig.7 Typical Output Characteristics(I)

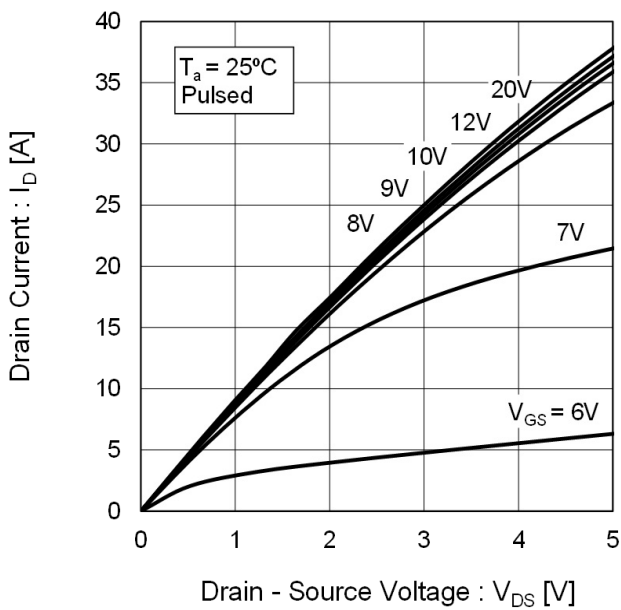
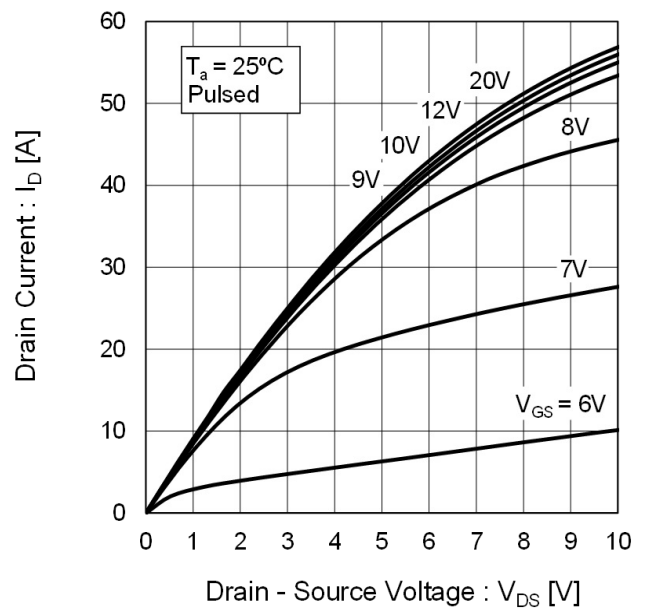


Fig.8 Typical Output Characteristics(II)

Fig.9 Typical Transfer Characteristics

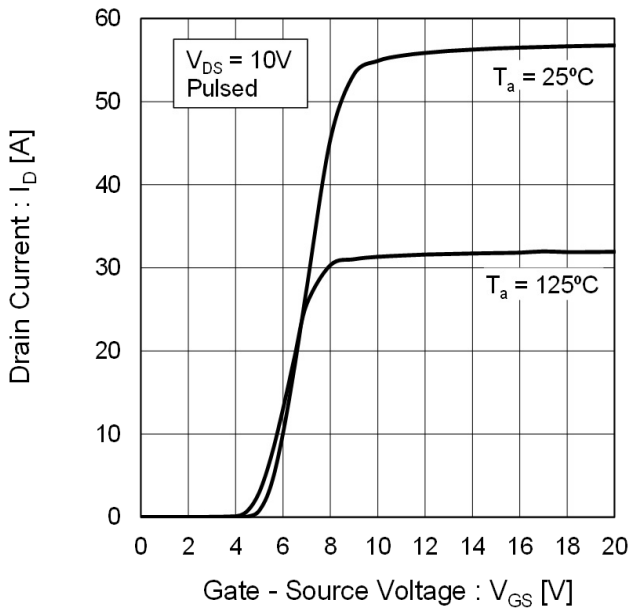


Fig.10 Normalized Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

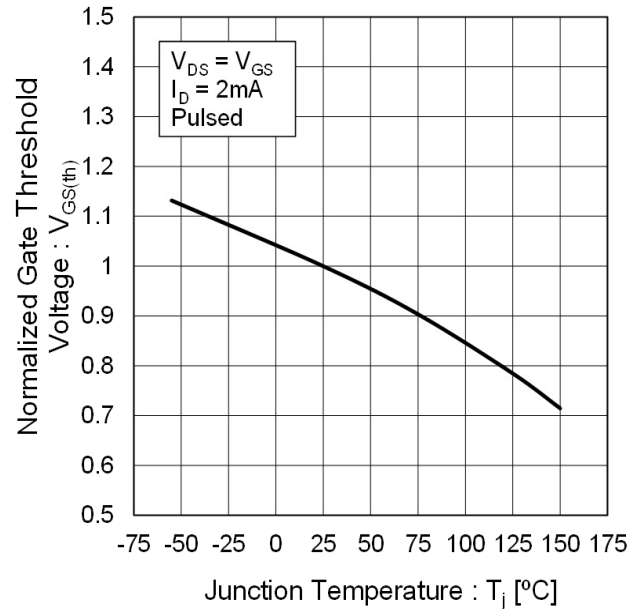


Fig.11 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage

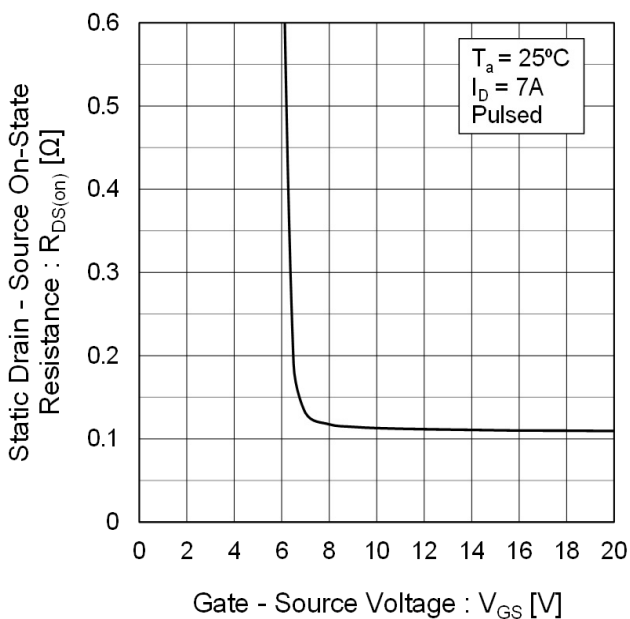
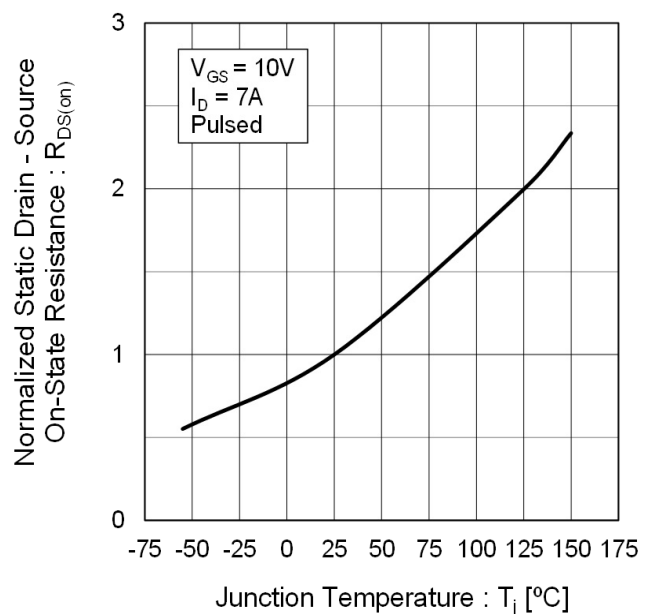


Fig.12 Normalized Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature

Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current

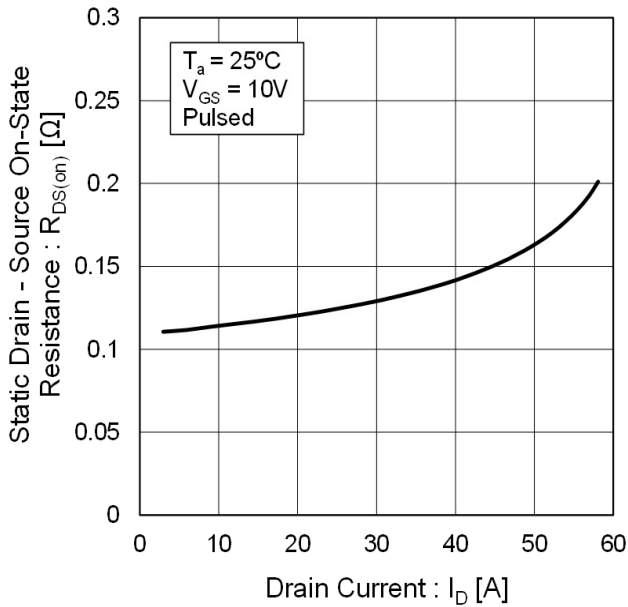


Fig.14 Capacitances

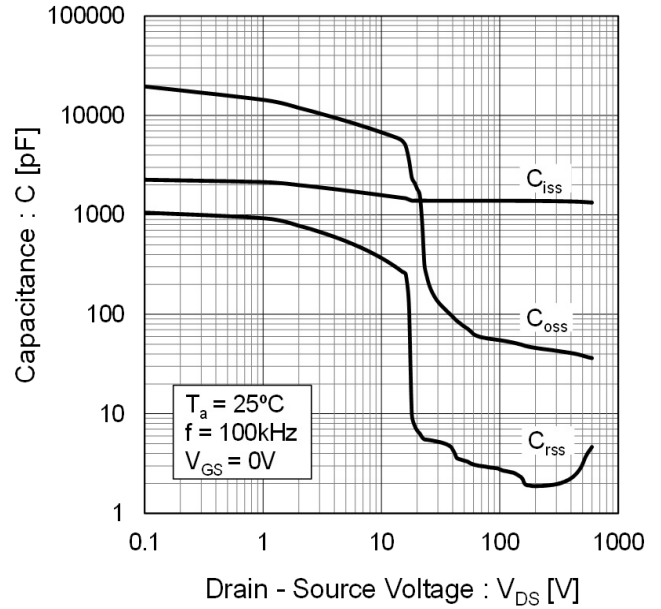


Fig.15 Coss Stored Energy

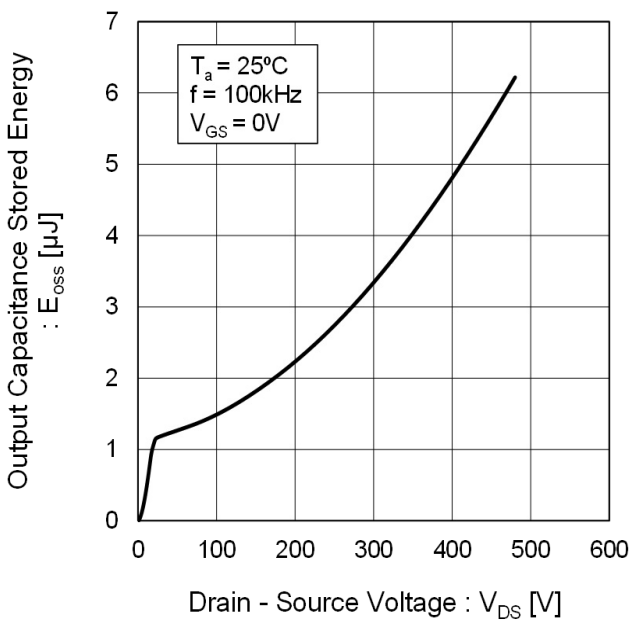
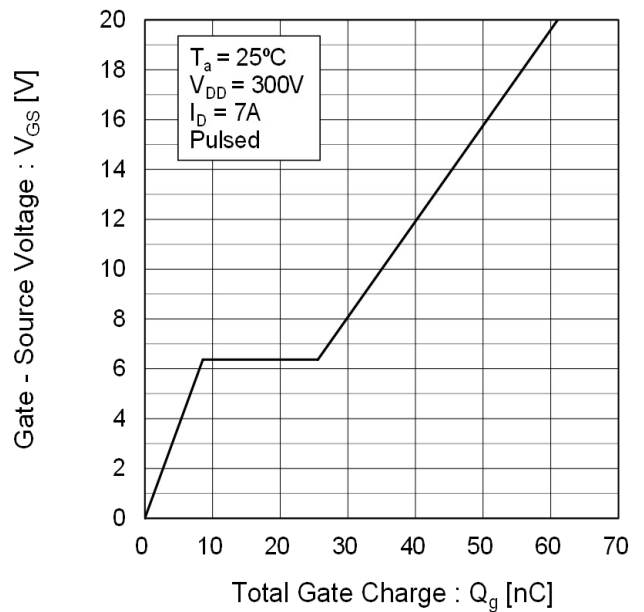


Fig.16 Gate charge

Fig.17 Source Current vs. Source - Drain Voltage

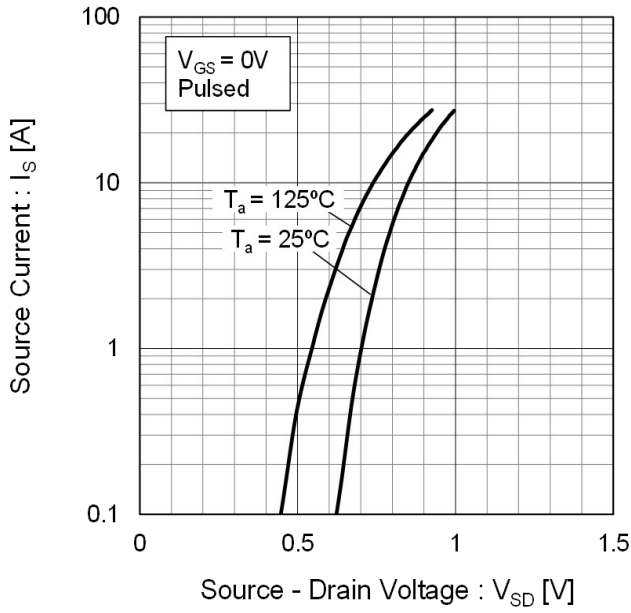
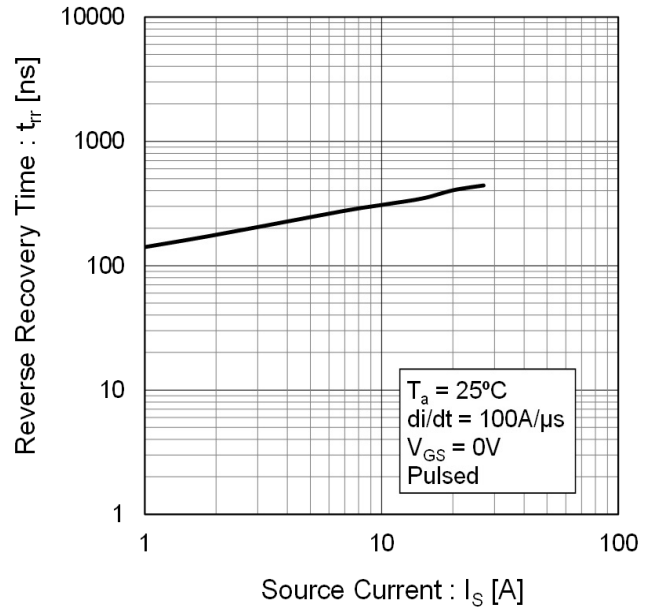


Fig.18 Reverse Recovery Time vs. Source Current

Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit

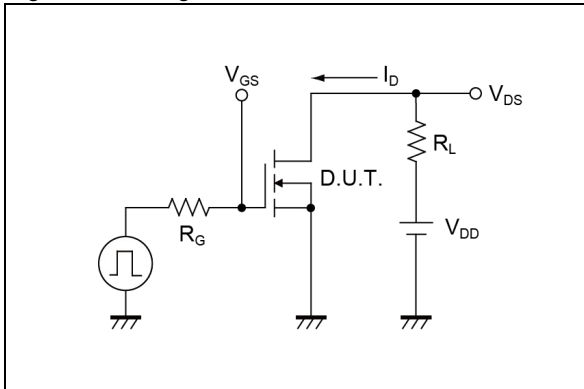


Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms

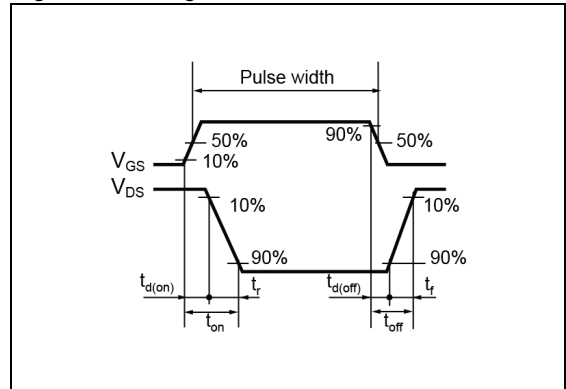


Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit



Fig.2-2 Gate Charge Waveform

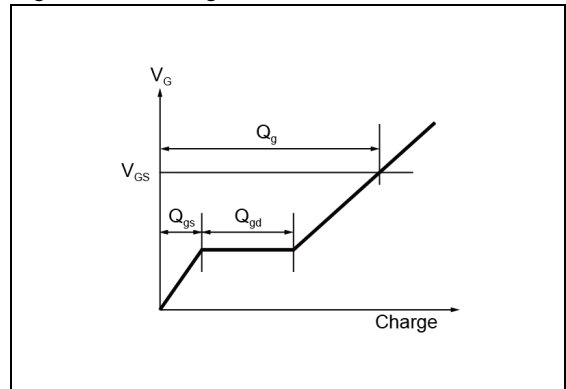


Fig.3-1 Avalanche Measurement Circuit



Fig.3-2 Avalanche Waveform

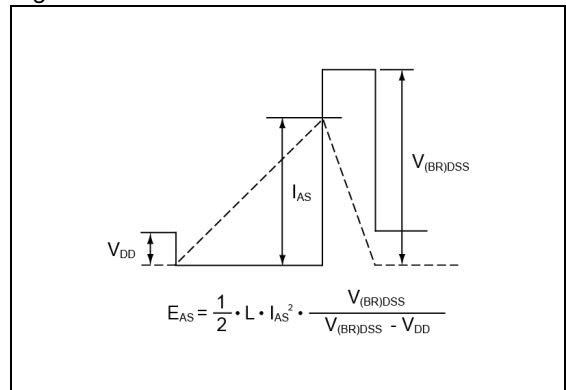


Fig.4-1 trr Measurement Circuit

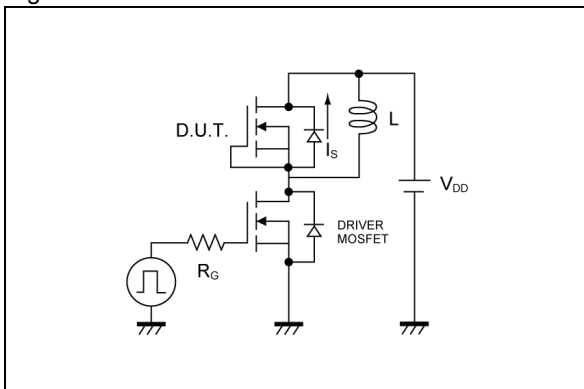
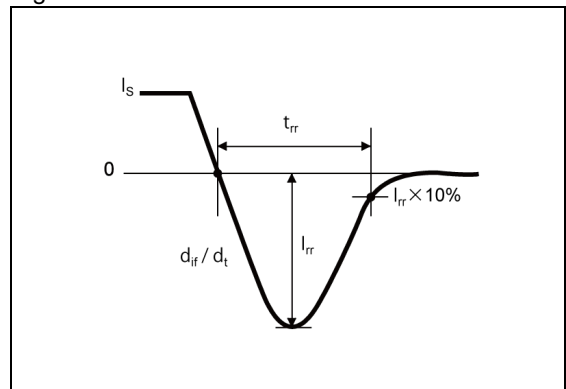
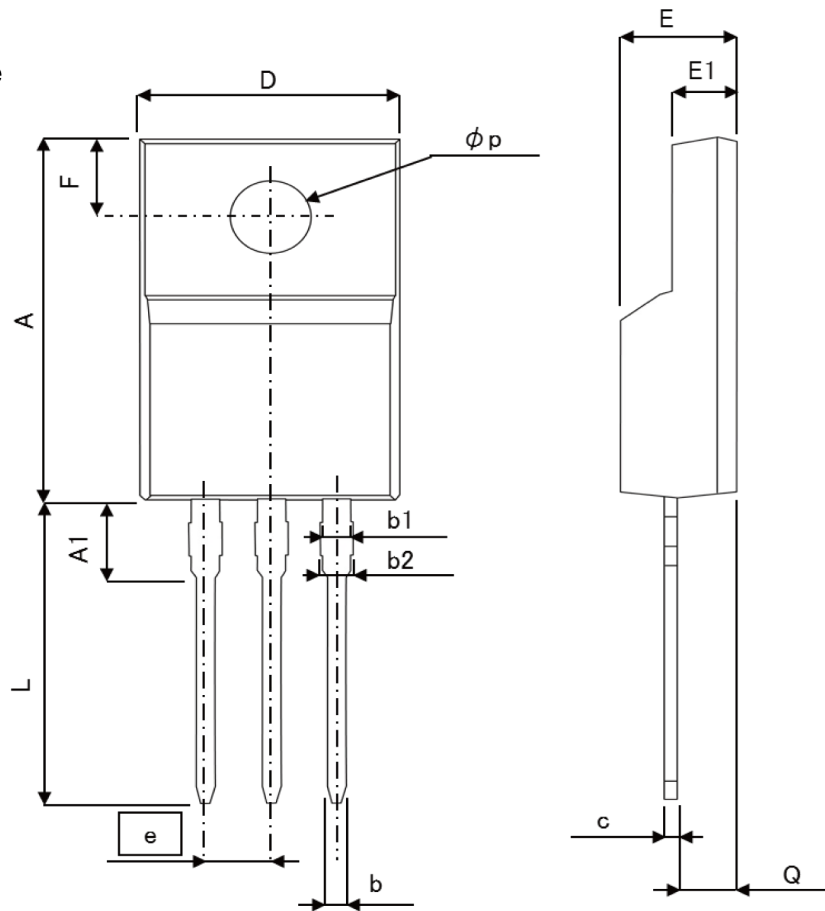


Fig.4-2 trr Waveform
