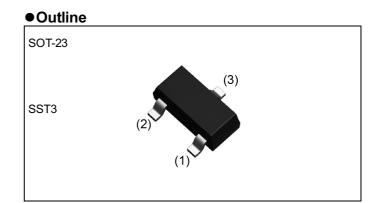

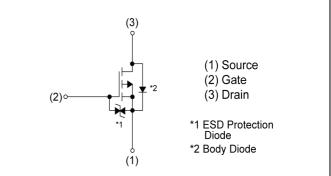

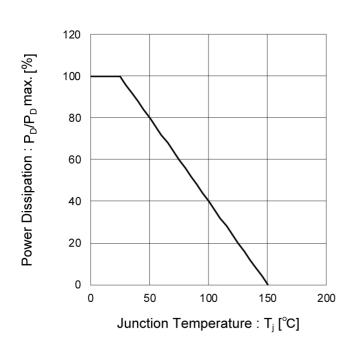


Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve

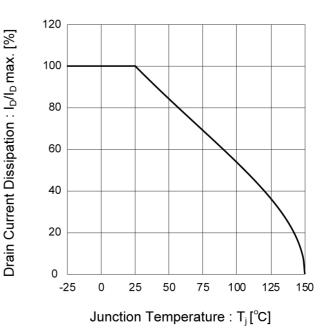
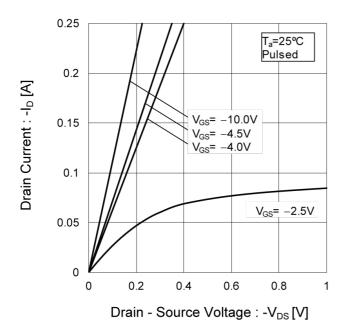
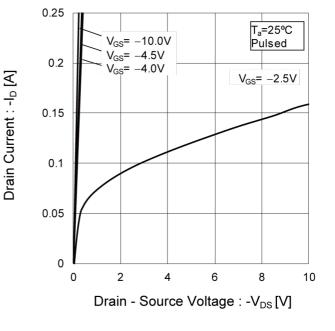


Fig.2 Drain Current Derating Curve

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Fig.4 Typical Output Characteristics(II)





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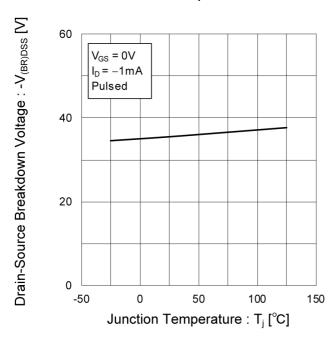


Fig.5 Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

Fig.6 Typical Transfer Characteristics

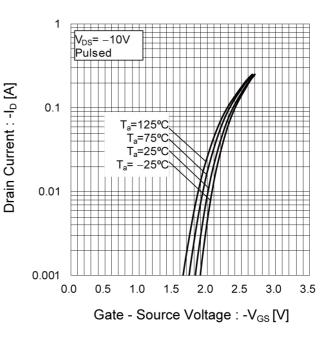


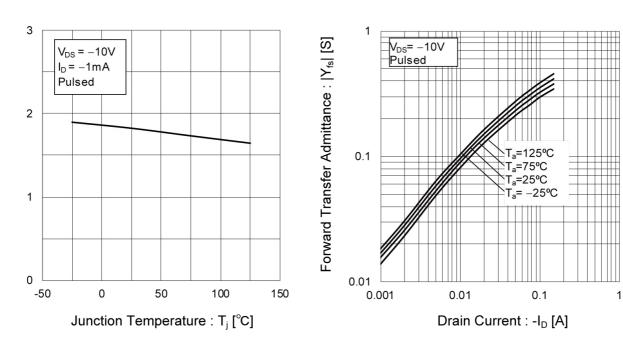
Fig.8 Forward Transfer Admittance vs.

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Fig.7 Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Junction Temperature





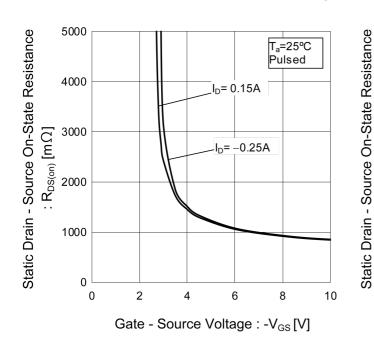


Fig.9 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage

Fig.10 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature

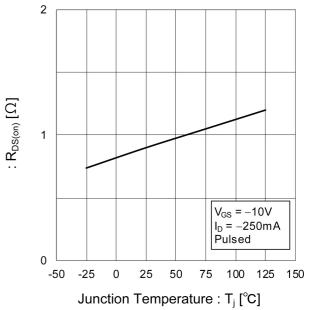
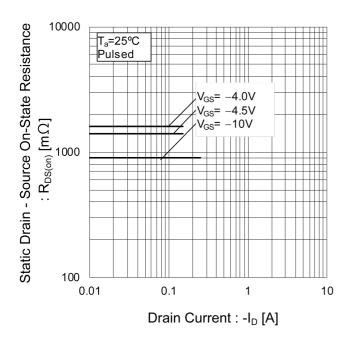


Fig.11 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (I)





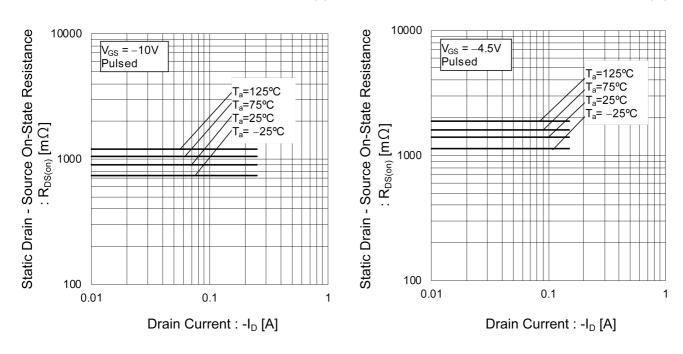
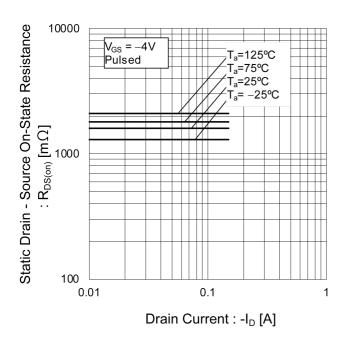


Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (II) Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (III)

Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (IV)





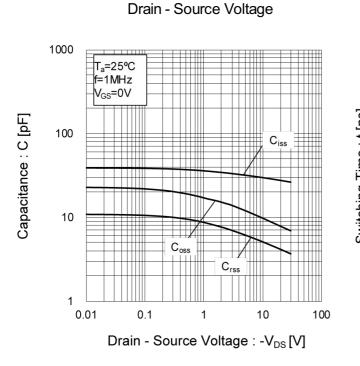


Fig.15 Typical Capacitance vs.

#### Fig.16 Switching Characteristics

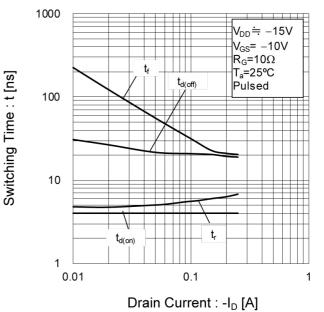
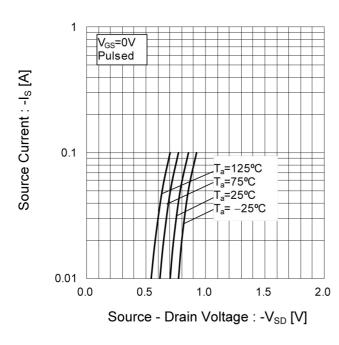


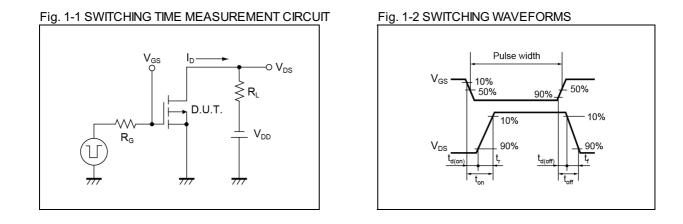
Fig.17 Source Current vs. Source Drain Voltage

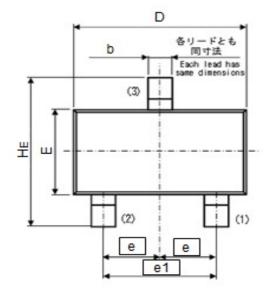


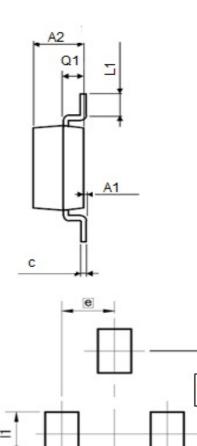
